EMERGING WOMAN ARCHITECT OF THE YEAR

ENTRY GUIDELINES

This award recognises excellence in design, thought leadership and a bright future ahead, with an emphasis on achievements in 2014.

Entrants to this award must be qualified architects but other than that the criteria is open - you may be younger than 40 years of age, or have been in your current post for less than five years. You may have just started a practice or be completing your first project within a large firm. Whether you are building pop-up cinemas in London, housing in Manchester or schools in Africa we want to know what makes you an emerging woman architect.

Last year the award was handed to sole-practitioner and PhD candidate Julia King. The British/Venezuelan's work focuses on the future of urban development. When she won the award she had already designed and built a sewer for 322 low-income houses in New Delhi and was working on the regeneration of the Taj East drain which runs through slum areas near the Taj Mahal.

Previous winners have also included Spanish architect Olga Felip, and John McAslan and Partners' Hannah Lawson.

The judges reserve the right to move entrants between categories.

28 November 2014

Conditions

- The award is open to applications from architects, sole practitioners and women-led practices
- Applicants can nominate themselves for the award, or someone else

What you will need to submit

There is no specific entry form for this award. Please submit a Word or PDF document with the following:

- Name of nominee
- Contact details of person submitting the entry – including a daytime telephone number
- Nomination statement – a maximum 300-word statement outlining the nominee's current work and practice
- Images and descriptions of selected projects. Any images sent should be copyright free and high resolution (300dpi at A4 size, to a maximum size of 10MB)
