ENTRY GUIDELINES

The Jane Drew Prize recognises a long-term commitment to the built environment and the architectural profession. The award will go to an individual architect who through their design work has raised the profile of women in architecture.

The award is named after the architect Jane Drew, who was a spirited advocate for women in a male-dominated profession.

Last year the award was given to Kathryn Findlay in recognition of her contribution to architecture.

Previous winners of the high-profile accolade include Eva Jiricna and Zaha Hadid.

The judges reserve the right to move entrants between categories
