# WOMEN IN ARCHITECTURE AWARDS 2015

## ADA HUXTABLE PRIZE

### ENTRY GUIDELINES

This award has been introduced to recognise those who may not be architects but who have made a significant contribution to architecture and the built environment.

The prize is named after architecture critic Ada Huxtable. She made history by being the first full time architecture critic at a US newspaper when she joined the New York Times, and was later awarded the first Pulitzer Prize for Criticism in 1970.

The award is open to individuals influencing the wider architectural industry, such as critics, politicians, clients, and planners

#### **Conditions**

- The award is open to applications from non-architects working within the field of architecture and the built environment
- Applicants can nominate themselves for the award, or someone else
